

# Displaying Artwork or Photography for Bundy Unplugged

If you would like to display your artwork or photography in person on the night of Bundy Unplugged, please contact Andy on <u>andrew.may@bpc.org.au</u>

If you would prefer to display your artwork or photography online then follow these steps:

### Step 1 – Take a good photo of your artwork

Make sure that the photo is in focus and is of a high resolution so people can see detail of your art.

#### Step 2 – Write or video a description of your artwork.

Include your name, the title of the piece, what the subject is about, why you took the photo or produced this piece of art, what this piece means to you.

If you would like to video your description but don't want to appear in the video, you can just provide an audio description that can be placed underneath your artwork.

#### Step 3 – Upload the photo of your artwork

Send your completed video to <u>andrew.may@bpc.org.au</u> using a link to the cloud (eg. Google Drive, iCloud,Dropbox, OneDrive) and not via USB.

You may be asked to resubmit your artwork if the the content is questionable or if the photo is out of focus or of too low a resolution.

Step 4 – Your artwork will be displayed on the Bundy Unplugged Website at bpc.org.au If appropriate, your artwork will be displayed online prior to the evening of Bundy. Unplugged so that people can begin enjoying your artwork immediately.

## Step 5 – If you would like to display your artwork live at Bundy Unplugged Please contact Andy and we can arrange for your artwork to be displayed.

You are welcome to submit multiple pieces of art or photography but not all may be displayed live depending on who else is displaying art.
